






# Accreditation

# Program Accreditation: The Process

- 1. Completion of the Self-Assessment
- 2. Self-Assessment reviewed by accrediting agency
- 3. Site visit (trust but verify!)
- 4. Accreditation Decision
- 5. Re-accreditation




