
POSTERIOR POLAR CATARACT


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POSTERIOR POLAR CATARCAT IS RARE FORM OF CONGENITAL CATARACT

IT IS USUALLY INHERITED AS AN AUTOSOMAL DOMINANT DISEASE, YET IT CAN BE SPORADIC





WHAT IS THE PROBLEM WITH THIS TYPE OF CATARACT DURING SURGERY?

THE ANSWER

IT IS HIGLY ASSOSIATED WITH COMPLICATIONS DURING SURGERY

1- POSTERIOR CAPSULE RUPTURE

2- NUCLUES DROP

THE REASON FOR THIS HIGH COMPLICATION RATE IS:

THE STRONG ADHERENCEOF THE OPACITY TO THE WEAK POSTERIOR CAPSULE

IMPORTANT SURGICAL STEPS WE SHOULD TAKE CARE OF

- 1. Capsulorhexis
- 2. Hydrodissection
